Come along to the Milson community Centre with your Android device (phone or tablet) on **Wednesday, 21 October** at **1:30 pm**. This is not just for beginners - everyone is welcome. You never know; you may have the makings of a tutor in you!



We are starting the Android Interest Group again and thought it would be a good idea after such a long lay-off, to cover some basics. We will start with connecting devices to Wi-Fi, and by the end of the first session everyone will know how to connect their phone or tablet to a network. We will use the SeniorNet Manawatū Wi-Fi for this, and from then on, whenever you come to a club meeting your device will always remember the password and log you into the Internet.

Even if you think you know everything there is to know about your phone, you will find that this is good, useful new beginning, and will lead on to a lot of other useful things. We will have enough tutors present to help everyone. The good thing about concentrating on the basics is that we should generate plenty of material for future sessions! PRIVACY ON FACEBOOK We've put together the top things to consider to help you with your privacy on Facebook. Facebook provides privacy setting options, so that people have control over who can see the information they put on Facebook. You can find more information about privacy, security and safety on [Facebook's online help centre](#).

Your name: The name you use on Facebook is always visible to others using Facebook. Facebook's terms of service don't allow fake names to be used, but you are able to use alternatives of your name such as a maiden name, nickname or a professional name.



Your profile picture: Your profile picture is always public, which means that others using Facebook can see it. For extra privacy, some people choose to use a profile photo without their face visible in it, or a photo that doesn't include them in it – e.g. a favourite photo of the beach. You can change the privacy settings on your old profile photos, so that they are not visible to the public. Some people use photos of their kids or grandkids in their profile photo.
