Last month we were busy doing Tech Help sessions and starting our Gmail class. We also ran a discussion session on Google Photos and were encouraged by the interest. Because of this interest, we will be running several workshops on using Google Photos to manage, edit and share your photos. We will start this sometime in April/May. We would also like to start an Interest Group for people keen on doing things with their photos (taking photos, photobooks, printing, editing etc.).

Kevin and I have also been involved in the newly enhanced SeniorHangouts website which should be live by the time you read this. We were involved in a group tasked with looking at how the site looks and functions. We did all of the good bits 😊.


Tech Help Sessions - What are they?

Most Wednesday mornings find us busy doing 'Tech Help' Sessions. While these are well attended and popular, we thought it might be worthwhile to expand on what we do. Other SeniorNet Centres around the country also run these sessions but using different names. For example, Kapiti calls their sessions 'How Do I ???'. We could use names like "Help with tech", "Can you help me with ???", "I need help with...", "Ask me anything" etc.

So, these 45-minute sessions are one-on-one, just you and a tutor (two tutors if you are lucky). We can use this time to help you with:

- a problem on your computer or smartphone,
- A question about how to do something,
- Advice on how best to tackle a task on your device,
- Advice on how to use your device,
- Ongoing tuition with a particular topic.

We think it's great value at \$5 for a session.


You can go to the Library to look for previous sessions. This version now includes a powerful search option for you to quickly find videos of interest.


