What is the SeniorNet Federation?

The Federation of New Zealand SeniorNet Societies supports the activities of learning centres with resources and funding. Learning centres retain their own independence as an incorporated society and registered charity.

New Zealand is divided into eight regions each with its own representative on the federation committee. Manawatū is in the Central North Island region which also includes Taranaki, Whanganui and Hawkes Bay. The regional representative is Mike Lawrence. A central office is operated by the executive officer, Heather Newell and an administration officer, Cathy Munford.

Some of the recent federation activities which have benefited learning centres and members include:

- The establishment of SeniorHangouts to share knowledge among members.
- Funding from Google, AMI Insurance and Westpac along with applications for other funding.
- Purchase discounts for members from Suzuki and Noel Leeming.
- Payment to learning centres for each hour spent on learning activities.

To arrange for a photo to be added to your card, visit your nearest AA Driver and Vehicle Training Licensing outlet with your card, along with **three forms of identification** that verify your name and date of birth, plus, evidence of your address. It's a free service for all SuperGold card holders.

Your photo will be taken and a new card posted to you - all free of charge.

Have you done your Wordle today?



The Irish Garda says, "Sounds fair. Exit your vehicle, sir." The London Lawyer exits his vehicle.



The Irish Garda takes out his baton and starts beating the lawyer with it and says, "Now do you want me to stop, or just slow down?"




Using Microsoft Edge: One of the new features - 'Web Capture'

Microsoft Edge's PDF reader gets a nifty new feature on Windows 11, Windows 10

To try it out, use the Settings and more menu (...) in the top right corner of the browser and select **Web capture**.



The **Web capture** tool in Microsoft Edge allows you to take a screenshot of sections or the entire webpage. Microsoft Edge and either copy, share, or save the screenshot. You can also use the tool to annotate your shot with comments or highlights,




Cartoon from the Dominion using Web Capture

You have heard us banging on about SeniorHangouts for a while now. But - warning - here we go again.

SeniorHangouts is an online facility that provides opportunities for learning and interacting with the presenter (we call them buddies) and the other audience members - just like a physical meeting. The learning is usually small discrete topics on many aspects of technology, from very basic to slightly more advanced (think of those as aspirational as we can all get there). This year we are also trialling a simple "Tech Help" session of 20 minutes where you can ask for help on a particular problem, or for some advice. This is just you, and a friend if you like, and one or two buddies.

The benefits to you include:

- Accessing live sessions from anywhere with an internet connection, on any digital device. This means you don't have to leave home - in fact, you could stay in bed to participate if you have no shame 😊.
- There may be reasons why you would prefer to stay home (we can think of at least one!). So, you can stay at home, and get some help or learn as well.
- Our special offer - free for SeniorNet members.
- There are 'buddies' and members from all over New Zealand, so meet new people and learn new things from new people.
- Access to recordings of previous sessions that you can watch anytime (better than Coronation Street?)
