Google Photos - Workshops

This month we will start out with our Google Photos Workshops. We are planning to hold two workshops at this stage. They will be run on consecutive Wednesday afternoons on the 18th and 25th of May, at 1:30 PM. No charge, but a gold coin or 2 in our Koha Jar would be appreciated.

Part one will cover:

- Installing the app on a phone or tablet
- Getting to the website on a laptop
- Uploading photos - manually and automatically
- How Google Photos works
- Looking at the major features



Part two will cover:

- Albums
- Searching for your photos
- Naming people and pets
- Editing photos (cropping and enhancing etc.)
- Sharing your photos

We also may hold further workshops, and perhaps a continuing Interest Group, at a later date to cover additional topics including using your photos:

- Printing
- Displaying on a device
- Photobooks
- Photo manipulation
- How to take better photos

SeniorNet Manawatū and Chromebooks



As you may know, we are fans of Chromebook computers as a simple and cheaper laptop alternative for Seniors (and others).

These are the simple systems a lot of schools are using with their students, for the same reasons that we like them. You may also know that we have run two classes in Feilding, for Manchester House Services, teaching beginners how to use a Chromebook to join this new Digital World. We thought we should look at doing something along the same lines in Palmerston North.

So, late last year we applied for a Lotto Grant to purchase 6 Chromebooks to provide a resource to run similar classes in Palmerston North. A couple of weeks back we received the funding for this project. We have just picked up 6 Lenovo Chromebooks and associated equipment, so now we need to plan how we can best utilise the equipment.

The idea is to run 6-week classes (one 2-hour session per week).

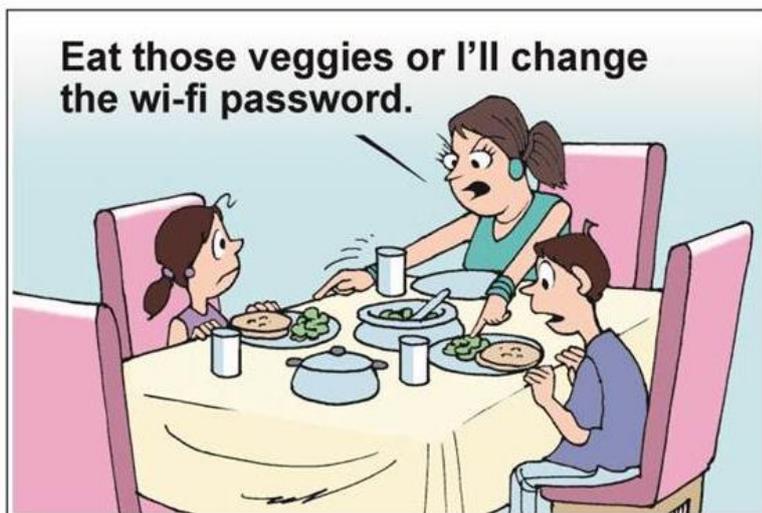
The student will start out using our devices and will commit to buying their own Chromebook before the class finishes.

We will look to advertise this in the near future, starting with other similar Senior organisations.

Identify plants with google lens

Take a picture with your camera on your Android Phone or Tablet, then open up that picture in the Google Photos app. Next, tap on the Google Lens button at the bottom of the screen.

It will tell you what kind of flower this is within seconds.

Identify Plants with Google Lens

For Android users, it's available as a standalone app. You can also access it via Google [Assistant](#).

Meanwhile, iOS users can get Google Lens bundled as part of the Google Photos app. They can also tap the Lens icon on the Google App's search bar.

Using it is far simpler to use. Once you open the app, your phone's camera turns into a Lens to what you can see.

But, how can you identify plants with it? To use this to identify a flower by a picture:

Tap the screen when you want to take a picture of an item.

1. Point it to the plant or flower.
2. Once you take a picture, Google Lens will display one main result. It will also show you similar photos.
3. Once you tap the photo, you get redirected to a Google search page with a description of the plant.

If you're using Google Photos for iPhone, here's how to do it:

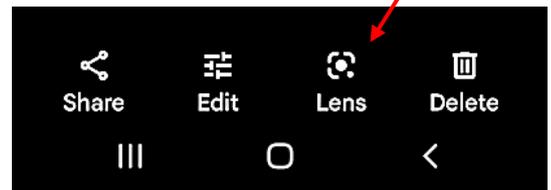
1. Take a picture with your regular camera.
2. Open that picture in the Google Photos app.
3. Tap on the Google Lens button at the bottom of the screen.
4. Then, Google will tell you what kind of flower this is within seconds.

Visual search engines like Google Lens connect the digital world to the real world. So, the next time you walk around and see a plant, bring your phone and use Google Lens.

How you can Report Problems to the City Council.

Download our smartphone app to help make reporting issues easy!



Types of incidents we encourage you to report

- cracked footpaths
- fallen tree branches
- potholes and other road issues
- graffiti
- dumped rubbish
- broken playground equipment

Report issues to Palmerston North City Council using the smartphone app “Snap Send Solve” It's free to download via the **App Store or Google Play**.

Just open the app, create a profile, snap a photo of the issue and send us a few details. We'll quickly get on to solving it.

The Snap Send Solve app works by identifying the location the photo is taken using your phone's GPS data.

It sends an email to the Council from your email address, including the incident type, notes, address of incident, photo, and contact details.

The report is then logged with the relevant team at Council.

The more information you provide, the better we can help isolate and investigate the issue.
